#### **MAYOR JOHNSON'S LETTER**

The time has come! I announced at the July 16th Council Meeting that I would not be filing for the Mayor's elected position again. I have been blessed with good health, but mobility issues limit what I can do, and age has a way of saying, Stop! I'll review some of my experiences in the next newsletter. Filings for City positions and School Boards are now open and close on August 13th at 5 pm.

It is hard to believe that most summer events and county fairs are a thing of the past. School sports teams and some colleges have



already begun their fall programs, and "The Great Minnesota Get Together" time is here. Thanks to those who hosted a "Night to Unite" event.

On our farm, the job of putting up hay is a never-ending job, but this year with all the rain we were unable to finish some of the first cutting of hay until it is ordinarily third cutting time. Some because of the continuing rain and other fields because they were too wet to drive in. And the hay was so thick! Soybeans where not drowned out seem to be thriving with all this rain, and some corn fields look worse than I have seen in years.

Since our last newsletter, Council received our official financial audit report for the City for calendar year 2023. Again, we received the best rating possible. Thanks to our City Staff and consultant partners!

As soon as the audit is done, staff and council began work on the next budget which is for 2025. That budget must be semi finalized by the end of September with a levy notification to the County. The City can reduce that levy amount through December of 2024 but cannot increase it.

It was nice not to have major road construction and detours in the City this summer. The construction in other cities did change the traffic patterns for some, however. Some local roads saw limited delays because of Midco's broadband work, road tiling, or even some minor flooding issues. Thank you for your patience!

November 5<sup>th</sup> is General Election day. Be sure to vote. The ballot will cover positions in the City of Independence, our local school boards,

county, state, and federal officials. Plenty of opportunities are available to vote early if you cannot make it to the polls on November 5<sup>th</sup>.

#### Independence Five Year Gravel Road Capital Improvement Planning

The city is in the process of finalizing a 5-year capital improvement plan for all gravel roads in Independence. This plan will consist of two phases and will ultimately result in the improvement of all gravel roads within the city. The initial phase will occur in 2025 and will focus on improving drainage, replacing culverts, correcting known impaired base areas, and recapping high traffic roads with new gravel. The second phase will be carried out over 5 years and will focus on similar improvements to the remainder of gravel roads not wholly improved with the initial phase.


The improvements will require a significant investment by the city; however, the city has committed to making this investment without individual property assessments. The city has also secured state and county road funding to offset a portion of the total project cost.

#### MIDCO Expansion in Independence Continues!

Midco began construction in April 2024 to bring fiber internet and phone services to previously underserved portions of Independence, thanks to a partnership with the Minnesota Office of Broadband Development and Hennepin County. The majority of the residents in this project area will have access to Midco services by the end of 2024. Midco has also informed the City of Independence of its plan to expand fiber to the remainder of Independence in the coming years!

As construction progresses, residents in the construction area will receive communications from Midco before the contractor starts working, including a door tag at your home or business. Those not yet 18 but will be 18 years old on Election Day may also pre-register to vote. Being pre-registered speeds up your Election Day voting by having your name on the roster of registered voters. Pre-register on-line at MNVotes.gov or stop in at City

- A fully online, month-long **Stop Food Waste Challenge** has unlimited participation and directs households to focus on actions to prevent wasting food.





#### **SEPTIC**

- 1. Keep long grass on septic to help prevent from freezing.
- 2. Keeping it pumped every 3-5 years allows it to be compliant and helps homeowners avoid costly repairs.

#### **CHIMNEY FIRES**

Chimney fires can be dangerous if the flue is not kept clean. Creosote can build up in chimney and cause fires. Burning Creosote logs doesn't work as well as brushing does for getting the creosote out of the chimneys.

#### Important Responsibilities for Property Owners

### CULVERTS— Why should I be concerned about the ones near my property?

Fall is the time that the ends of culverts located on or near your property must be cleaned out. Doing so now allows for proper water flow when the spring thaws. Uncleared culverts potentially prevent drainage allowing water to flow as it should and avoids ponding up.

#### What are my landowner responsibilities?

You are responsible for driveway culvert



maintenance. Culvert maintenance involves keeping both the inlet and outlet of the pipe free of debris so that it works properly, including removing snow and ice during the winter months whenever possible. To further clarify who is responsible for what, this image shows which are the landowner's, adjacent landowner's, and Independence Public Works' responsibilities.
