MAYOR JOHNSON'S LETTER

It is hard to believe that the last time I wrote an article was in early spring and I mentioned corn was already knee high in early June. Now summer is over, many students have been in school for a month, the State Fair is over and we are counting down until Thanksgiving and Christmas. Wow!

The City Council and staff have been working hard on preparing the 2017 budget and approved a preliminary levy of \$2,689,000 and a Pioneer Creek Watershed levy of \$66,200 at our September 13th meeting. This levy is up from last year but \$300,000 less than what we levied in 2009 at the beginning of the 'bust'. These numbers can only be reduced up until the final levy is established in December. Our City's hearing will be Tuesday, December 13th. The Hennepin County hearing will be on Tuesday, November 29th. (continued page 2)

Primary Election -Thank You Judges!

The Primary Election was held at Independence City Hall on Tuesday, August 9. Polls were open from 7:00 a.m. 8:00 p.m. The day began slowly since there was only one question on the ballot. We ended the day with 84 voters. While

it wasn't busy, it gave the Election Judges an opportunity to 'practice' on the new poll books. The poll book is similar to an iPad which has replaced the paper roster list. The judges did a great job!

The November election will include the Presidential, Congressional Representative, our local Senator, and Representative. Orono School District residents will be voting on a facility bond issue and a levy question, and Rockford School District residents will be voting on a levy question and a technology question. Mound School District residents approved a bond question this spring that will show up on

Since the State bonding bill and tax bill were never signed by the Governor and no special legislative session was called, our concern was what will get done on U.S. Highway 12. Fortunately, the Transportation Department found some money to do some minor improvements at the two County Road 92 intersections. This will be safer for those making left turns, but by no means a final solution for those intersections. The change to be made on the Long Lake bypass came from a different source of funding and we hope will make that area safer as well.

As some are aware, there used to be a 'Lion's

Club' in the area. In fact, they donated approximately \$150,000 towards building our present City Hall. A couple of St. Michael's Lion's want to help organize a club again in the Independence/Maple Plain area. If interested, contact City Staff or myself, and we will make the proper connections. Lion's members have been wonderful community project supporters.

Have a wonderful fall and be prepared to vote on November 8th.

The City of Independence has a small sewer system currently servicing approximately 260 properties. In addition to those properties currently hooked up to sewer there are approximately 30 more that have sewer availability. It was anticipated when the system was built in 1985, 1994 and 2012 that all of the properties that had sewer availability would be connected within a ten year time frame. Many of those proper-

ties with availability have not connected at this time. The age of the system and cost to maintain the infrastructure is not being met with the current fees being collected by those with sewer and the annual cost of those with sewer availability. In an effort to stabilize the sewer fund and continue to maintain the system the rates are anticipated to be increased in 2017. The City will host several open houses in October/ November to provide more information on why the rates will be increased and what that will look like going forward. If you are a new Independence resident, or did not vote in the 2014 Election, you can preregister to vote now! If you are not yet 18 but will be 18 years old on Election Day, you may also preregister to vote now. Being

register to vote now. Being pre-registered speeds up election day by having your name on the roster of registered voters when you go to vote. Pre-register on-line at https://mnvotes.sos.state.mn.us/
VoterRegistration/VoterRegistrationMain.aspx, or stop in at City Hall to pre-register. If you have questions, call the City at 763-479-0527.

Absentee vote in person- Sept. 23rd

Beginning September 23rd, you may cast an absentee ballot in person at City Hall during normal business hours. City and County offices are open for absentee voting from 10a.m.to 3p.m. on the Saturday before the election and until 5 p.m. on the day before the election.

Absentee Vote by mail

You may have an absentee ballot sent to you by completing an Absentee Ballot Application, available at mnvotes.org, at City Hall, or at your county's election office. Your ballot will be sent to you when it is ready-starting 46 days prior to the election if you applied for an absentee ballot in advance.

Tips for New Voters on Election Day

 You have a right to time off work to vote, without losing your pay, personal leave, or vacation time.

Sign in or register to vote.

- If you are registered to vote, your name will be on a list of voters. You just need to write your signature next to your name. If you are registered, you do not need to show ID when you sign in.
- If you did not register before Election Day, you must show proof of your current address. You must bring proper ID to register on Election Day. The most common form of ID is a valid Minnesota driver's license, learner's permit or ID. Your ID must have your current Independence address. Go to www.mnvotes.org for ID options.

Vote

- You will vote in a private area, and your vote is secret
- The ballot instructions will say how many candidates you can choose for each office. Usually it will say to choose one.
- Your ballot will count even if you do not vote on every race or ballot question.
- If you make a mistake, you have a right to ask for a replacement ballot.
- Take your ballot to the ballot box and insert the ballot in the counter machine.
