# MARVIN JOHNSON TRANSFERS THE GAVEL TO BRAD SPENCER

Mayor Marvin Johnson had asked Brad Spencer to run for Mayor when he was ready to retire knowing that his city experience and proven leadership would continue to serve Independence residents well, and voters agreed. Mayor Johnson officially transferred the gavel to Mayor Spencer at the January 7, 2025, Council meeting making him the City of Independence's 5th Mayor. His first official business was appointing Marvin Johnson as Mayor Emeritus of

the City of Independence allowing him to continue to represent the City on various advisory boards, coalitions, or similar organizations where he may attend meetings, provide insight, and report back to the Council. It was the beginning of many emotional celebrations honoring Marvin for going above and beyond these last 45 years. The last week of January over 400 people came to City Hall for 2 retirement celebrations. Several traveled from out of state and others sent words of appreciation from all over the country including Senator Amy Klobuchar, Congressman Tom Emmer, and National League of Cities' Small Cities Council colleagues Bo Perkinson, former Mayor of Athens, TN and Clyde Schulz, former City Council President Beulah, ND. Several presented him with awards and shared stories of how Mayor Johnson had powerfully influenced them personally and their organizations. His siblings and relatives witnessed our community's admiration and love for him firsthand.

Brad Spencer has served 15 years on Independence City Council, six years on Independence Planning Commission, and five years on Pioneer-Sarah Creek Watershed

Management Commission. He and his wife Lisa have lived in this community since 1997 and raised their family here. "I love my city and will do everything I can to keep it a great place for families to live and grow. His mantra is "Be good. Do the right thing. Leave a place better than it was when you arrived."

# BOARD OF APPEAL AND EQUALIZATION COUNCIL MEETING

# Tuesday April 15, 2025 at 6 pm

If you are questioning the value of your property's recent County assessment, follow these steps:

Call the County Assessor at 612-348-3046. You will need to enter your PID/Property ID Number & phone number. Your PID number can be found either on your statement – found online if you didn't receive it via mail. From Hennepin County Property Information Search webpage, enter your PID/property ID number or Address, and select Search. Then select 2025 Proposed Property Tax (Truth in Taxation Statement) hennepin.us/residents/property/assessment (Their video is very informative.)

Call City Hall by Thursday, April 10 at 763-479-0527 and ask to be added to the Local Board of Appeal & Equalization meeting's Agenda. Then the Council will address yours at 6 p.m. on Tuesday, April 15th, 2025.

If needed, appeal at the County Board of Appeal meeting (virtually). Both previous steps are required prior to Step 3.

## **2025 BUDGET INFORMATION**

City Council has adopted a final budget that again (8 consecutive years) reduces the applicable municipal tax rate from 31.5% to 31.2%. This reduction is the result of the City Council's continued direction and oversight to operate an efficient, effective and value driven local government. This reduction in the City's tax rate will equate to a corresponding reduction in City taxes on residential and commercial properties year over year (assuming a flat market valuation – market valuations are determined by Hennepin County Assessors Office).


Note: the city's portion of property taxes only comprises approximately one-third of the total property tax for an individual property. The remaining amount is comprised of approximately one-third Hennepin County and one-third school district. Since 2017, Independence has held flat or decreased its applicable local tax rate while continuing to provide a high level of services to its residents. The City's reduction in tax rate is significant given the recent history of high inflation rates, continued increases to all insurance premiums, emergency services costs, and other cost increases to general operating expenses.

The City continues to maintain and update its long range (10 plus year) capital planning for streets, utilities, equipment, and buildings. The City will continue to fully fund all capital expenditures so that acquisition of new equipment and maintenance of buildings and facilities is paid for with cash rather than with issuance of debt.

As a part of the 2025 budget, the City has increased funding and is updated its long-range street plan to improve all gravel roads in the City (3-6" of new gravel, improved drainage, culvert replacement, etc.).


## 2025 Projected General Fund Revenue






## 2025 Projected General Fund Expenditures

# MIDCO EXPANSION IN INDEPENDENCE CONTINUES!

Midco is working to build out 100% of the City with high-speed fiber in 2025 and 2026. This will result in residents seeing work within the city right of ways at various times during the build out. Midco began construction in 2024 to bring fiber internet and phone services to previously underserved portions of Independence, thanks to a partnership with the Minnesota Office of Broadband Development and Hennepin County. At the end of 2024, over 400 homes and businesses had access to Midco services! To find out if your address is active and see their progress, visit Midco.com/Independence.

In 2025, plans are underway for Midco to continue expansion with the goal to reach all of Independence by the end of the year! As construction progresses, residents in the construction area will receive communications from Midco before the contractor starts working, including a door tag at your home or business. In addition, Midco plans to begin offering its next-generation video product to Independence residents.

Once services are activated, you'll have access to up to 5 gigs of symmetrical internet speeds backed by a best-in-class customer experience. # BAT HOUSES - REDUCING MOSQUITOS BEFORE SUMMER

Have you ever considered building a bat house to better control mosquitoes on your property? If not, you might enjoy Hennepin County's Bat House Brochure and perhaps adding this to your Spring project list to be able to enjoy your summer more! Nicole Witzel, Hennepin County Environment and Energy Wildlife Biologist shared that bats typically become active at the same time as the insects, so its usually around April-ish when they start coming out from hibernation. # PROHIBITED-CONTROL NOXIOUS WEEDS PREVENTION

The City's Public Nuisances (code 2010.05) prohibits **noxious** weeds, and staying ahead of them is the best way to avoid frustration for your neighbors and you!

#### **HOW TO CONTROL OR ERADICATE:**

Before they start blooming, cut, disc, plow, or treat with herbicide labeled for the noxious weed to be controlled or eradicated. Repeating control or eradication measures are necessary in order to prevent the ripening and scattering of noxious weed seed or other propagating parts. Planting drought tolerant perennials also helps crowd them out. You can follow MN Board of Water & Soil Resources and utilize expert advice and appendixes found in this their invasive species plan: bwsr.state.mn.us. Discover the difference between "Prohibited-control noxious weeds" and "Prohibited-eradicate noxious weeds" mda.state.mn.us/plants-insects/minnesota-noxious-weed-list.


