MAYOR JOHNSON'S LETTER

As I was pondering what to write about for this newsletter the idea that kept popping into my head was "change". Presently and ahead!

Since the Maple Plain Food Center closed and the Maple Plain Cleaners a month later, two places I frequented often, I haven't established a routine to fill those needs. Change takes time!

Since the election November 6th we found out there would be a lot of government changes. Changes because new people will be taking the place of people that we have worked with – some for a long time – for example, we have a new Sheriff. On the County Board we have two new County Commissioners. At Metropolitan Council, we will have a new district representative and a new Chairperson (both appointed by the new Governor). We have several new Hennepin County Legislators, a new Congressional Representative, a new Governor and all new State Officers.

Many of these newly elected people I have never worked with in the past or even heard of. However, I have had the opportunity to meet and talk with our new Congressman Phillips three times since the election, have worked with the

Since our last newsletter the City Council approved the final levy, as did the Hennepin County Commissioners, school districts and other government agencies. Our levy remains the same as what was proposed in September. Our average home value is \$409,000.00. Our tax rate is remaining at 40%. Thanks to our staff for their hard work in budget preparation! Our neighboring Wright County Board voted to increase their tax levy by 17.3% for next year. That is a major change!

Final steps are being taken to make changes to our 2040 City Comprehensive Land Use Plan. The Council, Planning Commission and Land Use Planning Committee have met several times and there will be a public "hearing/ open house" scheduled soon before the plan is submitted to the Metropolitan Council. There are very few changes from the 2030 Comp Plan. Visit ci.independence.mn.us to view the Comp Plan!

West Hennepin Public Safety has announced the dates for the 2019 Citizens Police Academy. The Citizens Police Academy will start on February 14, 2019 and will end with graduation on April 4, 2019. The Academy runs for eight weeks, one day a week, Thursday nights, from 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 pm.

WHAT IS IT?

The Citizens Academy is a FREE 24-hour block of instruction, sponsored by the Crime Fund, designed to give citizens knowledge about how your public safety department operates, our policies, procedures, programs and challenges. In addition, you will be introduced to government officials and staff and learn about the responsibilities of their respective offices. Participants in each session will commit to meeting 3 hours, one night a week for 8 weeks. The Citizens Police Academy was designed to create a better understanding of law enforcement through education. The Citizens Police Academy participants are presented with realistic hands on information, which will help each participant better understand the police department functions. The classroom and hands on information covers: DWI and Traffic Enforcement, home security, personal security, use of force, including deadly force which includes a demonstration of the Taser Gun and FATS training (firearms simulation), Hennepin County Dispatch Center, Court procedures including testifying before a Judge and many other areas related to law enforcement. 
WHY SHOULD I ATTEND?

Driveway Plowing Policies





Please note it is unlawful to dump, plow or push snow from private driveways onto highway or city streets whether you are plowing your driveway or have hired someone to

remove snow. Snow dumped on highways or street right-of-way can create a hazard not only for motorists, but also for snowplows. Even heavy snowplows have been ditched and damaged when hitting compacted and frozen snow. The person responsible for depositing snow on roadways may be liable in a civil lawsuit if damages or injuries occur as a result of this action. Under MN Statutes, Chapter 160.2715, RIGHT-OF-WAY USE, violation of the above statute is a misdemeanor, **City Ordinance 2018-04** states from November 1 through April 15 of each year and between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m., it shall be unlawful to park or permit to be parked, or continue to park or permit to stand, any vehicle upon any city street. Also, following a snow fall of 3 inches or more in depth, it shall be unlawful to park or permit to be parked, or to continue to park or permit to stand, any vehicle upon any street until the snow has been plowed from the street or the same has been otherwise disposed of.

Note to Residents with City Sewer:

State law limits City responsibility for sewer back-ups because the City does not have exclusive control of the City's sanitary sewer system. Damage can occur to homes and property for which the City will not be legally liable. As a result, a prudent homeowner may wish to discuss purchasing additional coverage with their homeowner's insurance carrier/ agent.

<u>DO NOT</u> put paper products such as paper towels, moist towelettes, tissue, handy wipes, disposable towels, diapers, sanitary napkins, condoms, and feminine products down the drain. The only paper that should be flushed is toilet paper.

<u>DO NOT</u> dump cooking grease and oils down the drain. Flushing out the grease with hot water will not work either; this only causes a build up further down the drain and eventually contributes to a stoppage in the lateral or sewer pipes. Avoid using chemicals that claim to dissolve grease, such as vinegar and baking soda. Those products only dislodge grease clogs and move them further down the pipe, which can lead to similar problems. To dispose of cooking grease, pour it into a heat-resistant container, and allow it to cool and set. That container should then be disposed in the regular garbage.
